## Devonshire development moving forward

WINFIELD, W.Va. — The Putnam County Commission on Tuesday completed the last official action to approve the issuance of tax increment financing bonds needed for the Devonshire residential devel-

opment to move forward.

Located off of Hedrick Road in Scott Depot, the roughly \$3 million project being built by Cathcart Construction, LLC, is expected to have apartments for rent and townhomes for sale as early as November.

At just larger than 100 acres, Devonshire will be among the

largest residential development built in Putnam County. Current building plans show 168 one-, two- and three-bedroom apartments, 174 two- and three-bedroom townhomes, 70 one-, two- and three-bedroom condominiums and 59 single-family homes.

The property will include a

club house with a resort-style pool, fitness center, club room, movie theater, massage and tanning area, business center, conference room and billiards parlor.

In other news, the commis-

sion reports that just less than \$24,000 has been expended thus far toward the planning and architectural design of the proposed Putnam County Animal Relief Center. Also, \$20,000 in designated state economic development funds were approved for transfer to be applied toward the center.
